Lois Elaine Johns, 60, of Winslow, Arkansas went home to be with her Lord & Savior on February 12, 2012 after a courageous 2 year battle with cancer. She was born Lois Elaine Juett on July 27, 1951 in Aurora, Nebraska to Aaron and Imageyne Juett. She spent her first years in Muskogee, OK, then her childhood through early teens in Panama where her parents were missionaries. She lived in the Rio Grande Valley from 1968 till 1985, then moved to Houston, and then settled in Winslow, AR in 1990.

She graduated from Nebraska Christian High School in 1969 and studied art at Pan American University in Edinburg, TX.. She was a talented & gifted artist. She loved to paint, always paying attention to the smallest detail, and signed her art, "Sweet Things by Lois". She designed an instructional painting book, "Seasonal Scriptures" which was published in 2002 & sold in Hobby Lobby. She loved to read & enjoyed scrap booking. 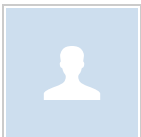
